Highlights and Fire / EMS Incidents

Engine 64:

After a year of planning, patiently waiting a two-year manufacture time and two months of training and equipment mounting, the 2023 E-One Cyclone Pumper is now in service. The occasion was symbolic as the Board of Trustees and other special guests participated in a Push-In Ceremony. The engine will serve both communities out of Station 64 in Indian Hill.

Terrace Park Structure Fire



Date: Tuesday, November 28th:

Time: 04:00AM

Location: The Birch Restaurant

Units: Terrace Park, Milford, Anderson, Mariemont,

Brief: Automatic mutual aid to Terrace Park for structure fire. Engine 64 crew arrived just behind Milford and assisted with extinguishment. Fire began just to the left of main entrance in courtyard and traveled up the wall into attic

space. Fire was being investigated by Ham Co Fire Investigation Team, no injuries reported.

Training:

Fire: Crews worked on new engine operations including TurboDraft evolutions at Stepping Stones with Terrace Park and Milford FD. TurboDraft allows MIHJFD to get water from a static source, such as a pool or pond up to 200' away, to supply additional water for firefighting. TurboDraft will be used in areas with low or inadequate flow hydrants. New part time employees that were hired earlier in the fall continue their orientation and probationary training on their respective shifts.

Rescue: Swift water rescue team training was cancelled. One day of USAR training focused on breaching and breaking concrete at Baker Concrete in Monroe.

EMS: Online training for all personnel to include 2024 protocol changes.

FAO: All personnel: New engine operations and FF /Medic Smith working toward FAO and FF / Medic Feldmann towards Quint operator.

Officer's Training: Lt. McCarthy and Captain Lynch attended a mid-rise training hosted by Montgomery FD.

Personnel:

The process to replace a career FF/Paramedic position was initiated. Applications were accepted on-line until the Wednesday before Thanksgiving. We received 21 applications for either lateral entry or to test. The lateral entry candidates were evaluated and given a numeric score based on their certifications and education. The other candidates were given a written fire and EMS exam. We provided 3 opportunities to sit for the test and exams are to be graded once all candidates are tested on Tuesday, 12/5/2023.

Station Maintenance: Fire alarm systems for both stations were repaired by Dial One. The personnel repaired the washing machine at Station 65. Also, crews worked on fall maintenance to prepare yards and beds for the winter months ahead.

Projects: We continue to work on several projects regarding apparatus and personnel deployment:

- **Hydrants:** data entry of undated GPS coordinates from Fall hydrant inspections is 50% complete and will be completed in ESO and Active 911 in December. Crews will be pumping hydrants on the GCWW side to prepare for winter freezing temperatures. We currently has 15 hydrants listed out of service in the JFD.
- **New Engine:** Work continues to wrap up mounting equipment with very little work remaining. The unit is in-service.
