Madeira HazMat - Methane leak

Date: September 6th: **Time**: 2:00 PM

Location: 7115 Miami Ave

Units: MIHJFD, GCHazMat, Ohio EPA, Ohio DNR Oil and Gas, City of Madeira

Brief: Drilling contractor for a local Madeira business on Miami struck a naturally occurring gas pocket in the

284 foot well.

Mitigation: Vent the gas until pressures decrease and then the contractor will fill the well per Ohio ODNR and MIHJFD recommendations. We monitored the site and buildings around the property for the remainder of the

month. The well is scheduled to be filled within the first two weeks of October.

What: One Alarm Multifamily Residential Structure Fire

Units: Quint 65, District 64 and Car 6401

Cause: Under investigation by Sycamore Twp FD and Hamilton County Fire Investigation Team

Brief: Heavy smoke in apartment on the second floor of middle unit. Opened up walls and ceiling and found fire in wall and roof structure with no injuries reported. Several residents displaced.

Cause: Under investigation by Sycamore Twp. FD and Hamilton County Fire Investigation Team

Brief: Return to address with heavy fire showing on arrival. Extensive mutual aid units needed for this incident. Several residents displaced, no injuries reported. It is unknown if the fire was a rekindle or another fire at time of report. Quint crew worked with other arriving units to search apartments and control the fire.
